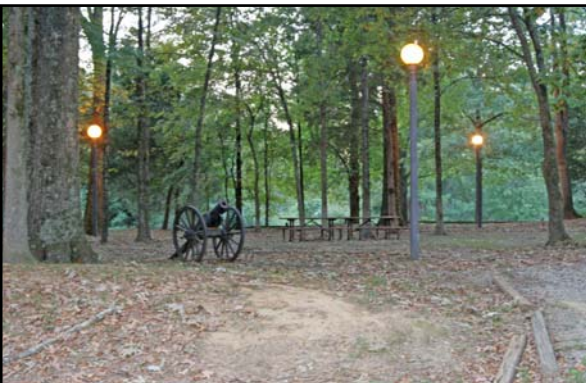




## PRESERVING THE PAST FOR OUR FUTURE

Fort Germantown rests within a quiet subdivision east of Memphis, Tennessee. A five-acre park hosts modern day visitors to the old 110 foot-square earthwork redoubt that was once home for a contingent of Soldiers from the 49th Illinois Infantry Regiment. Those troops guarded the adjacent Memphis and Charleston Railroad from attacks of the Confederate Army Raiders.



It was one of a large number of similar outposts, built throughout the South by the Union Army to protect supply lines. It is also one of only a few such sites that survive today.

Buchart Horn helped preserve this Civil War site by providing historic documentation, restoration design and construction management for the project that saved Fort Germantown and show-cases it within a public park.
